The NHS Leadership Academy have developed a new digital tool to complement their work around the <u>Healthcare Leadership</u> <u>Model</u>, which supports our NHS people to become better leaders in their day-to-day roles.

The <u>Healthcare Leadership Model App</u> allows you to record observations about the leadership behaviours that you see around you and explore these using the nine leadership dimensions of the healthcare leadership model. It is free to access and available to all health and care colleagues to help them develop as a leader – even if they are not in a leadership role.
